Midland Memorial Foundation is excited to announce the 2023 annual endowment gift of \$1,520,652!

Because of the generosity of donors and careful management of funds, the Foundation's endowment gift continues to grow each year. This year, the gift will go toward the purchase of state-of-the-art equipment that will greatly enhance the hospital's capabilities. This new equipment includes a peripheral lung navigation (PLN) system, an endobronchial ultrasound system (EBUS), new bronchoscopes, and much-needed system upgrades.

With the purchase of the peripheral lung navigation system, Midland Health expands its ability to provide early lung cancer diagnoses and treatment. In turn, lung cancer patients at Midland Health will no longer have to travel out of the community for lung cancer staging and surgical procedures. The PLN will provide a minimally invasive biopsy procedure for patients at Midland Memorial Hospital.

The second piece of equipment performs an endobronchial ultrasound bronchoscopy. This procedure is used to diagnose lung disorders, including inflammation, infections, or cancer. Performed by a pulmonologist, the EBUS bronchoscopy provides a minimally invasive technique that allows physicians to display real-time and improved images of the respiratory system.

The echocardiography department requested three new echo ultrasound systems and upgrades to the four existing systems. The new systems are needed to support the increased number of vascular ultrasound procedures. One of the new imaging features is a 3-D volume analysis that will improve imaging quality and provides cardiologists with more accurate and consistent heart measurements.



UPDATE: Permian Behavioral Health Center

Permian Basin Behavioral Health Center passed a major milestone at the end of October with the commencement of Phase 1 construction, including site, foundation and steel structure work. On October 19, 2023, the Texas Facilities Commission approved an initial construction agreement with Robins & Morton for a total of \$57.2 million and authorized work to begin immediately, meeting the State's deadline to fully encumber the initial \$40 million in state/federal funding for the project. The project site is within the city of Midland's extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ), annexation and zoning have been secured, and final platting and permitting are expected to be completed in November.

During the 2023 Texas legislative session, the State committed approximately \$2.25 billion in new funding for mental health infrastructure, funding both state hospital replacement/expansion and smaller community-based initiatives like PBBHC. Our project received an additional \$86.7 million to add 100 beds, bringing the total capacity to 200 inpatients. The State's chief requirement under this appropriation is to provide a minimum of 40 beds for competency restoration, allowing non-violent criminal defendants who are not mentally competent for trial to be hospitalized and undergo state-mandated education and therapy.

Statewide, over 2,300 defendants are in custody, primarily in county jails, awaiting a competency restoration bed in a state hospital and experiencing wait times that routinely exceed a full year. PBBHC is working with consultants from Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute to contract with the State to pay the operating costs associated with care for this forensic population.

Robins & Morton has completed a pricing exercise based on the expanded project's design development drawings, reaffirming a total project budget of \$225 million. As of October 30, over \$208 million has been formally committed by the State, local foundations and private individuals. Fundraising efforts are continuing to secure the final \$16+ million.

In addition to these fundraising efforts, final construction drawings are being prepared and should be issued for bidding by mid-December 2023. The project is scheduled for opening in November 2025.

Thanks to our community leaders' foresight in beginning pursuit of a regional solution nearly ten years ago, the Permian Basin will soon be served by a high-quality, comprehensive behavioral health center.





Midland Health Scholarship Program Fund


We are pleased to share that the Midland Health Scholarship Program with Midland College has been successful in the first few months of the program. The Midland Health Scholarship Program addresses the pressing need for entry-to-practice certifications that serve the critical need for various staffing positions at our hospital. In addition to students working toward an Associate Degree in Nursing, scholarships for Respiratory Therapists, Radiology Technicians, Phlebotomy, Pharmacy Technicians, Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) and Surgical Technicians are available.

To date, 19 students have enrolled in the program at Midland College. Beginning with the Fall 2023 semester, there is the commitment to fund six Associate Degrees for RN, eight Radiology Technologists, two Respiratory Care Technicians and three LVN certifications.

After the students complete the courses and receive the certifications, they agree to work at Midland Health for a determined length of time based on the degree or certification. Not only does the program guarantee a job, their expertise serves the critical need at Midland Health and in our community.

The Midland Health Scholarship Fund was established to assist in funding this important program that benefits not only our patients, but local citizens that want to pursue a career in healthcare.
